


2024 Budget Preparation and Pledges

"The God of...."

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in faith so that you overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." *Romans 15:13*

We hear and speak of God being "the God of...." Fill in the blank. There's lots of "things." The Bible has a few of its own references to "the God of...." as well. Here's a few:

The God of Abraham (and Sarah). The God of heaven and earth. The God of Israel. The God of our/my salvation. The God of life. God of compassion and mercy. God of my/our praise. God of justice. God of all living things. God of heavenly forces. God of my/our deliverance. God of endurance and encouragement. God of hope. God of love and peace. God of all comfort. God of all grace. The God of the spirits of the prophets. God of the humble.

God of our Lord Jesus Christ.

In the Hebrew scriptures (the Old Testament), God is mostly the God of ancestors and of heavenly forces. There's a few references to compassion, mercy, deliverance and salvation. The Psalms include variations of addressing God as the God of my or our praise. Things shift a bit when we get to the Christian scriptures (New Testament), especially when we get to the Epistles. I chalk it up to the influence of the Greeks who, at the time, were die-hard polytheists and gave us Greek mythology and gods and goddesses like Aphrodite, the goddess of love, sex and beauty. And Eros, the god of love and lust. And Poseidon, god of the sea, horses and earthquakes. We can't discount the Roman influence as well, thinking about Janus the god of beginnings and passages (hence the name "January" for the first month of the year.)

Apparently, we like to make sure that our 'gods' have a job to do. It's also handy to know just which "god" it is we can blame for things.... Like earthquakes and lust. If we take that propensity to want to give God a job to do or to be responsible for something in the human realm, as followers of Christ, it might be a good idea to start there, with Jesus. What characteristics of Jesus compel us to fall in love with him and follow him and can we see something of God in those qualities? If Jesus is the offspring of God, what "genetic traits" does Jesus get from God?

I think the writer of Romans is on to something in their calling upon the God of Hope to use the divine power to fill folks with joy and peace. What greater power could there be than to fill the world with joy and peace? It's a power that emerges from God's most important job... to love the world and all that is in it.

This Sunday, we will light the fourth candle on the Advent Wreath on our way to Christmas. It's the candle of Love. Leading up to it, we have lit the candles of Hope, Peace, and Joy. Perhaps we have not simply been lighting candles but have been calling upon God's hope, peace, joy, and now love to fill the world to overflowing. It's God's job. As followers of Christ, it's ours as well.

May the God of Jesus Christ fill you in abundance with Hope, Peace, Joy and Love.
