


The service will be live-streamed and a recording of the livestream service will be available on YouTube later in the day.




Four Chaplains Memorial Service Sunday, February 4th at 2:00 P.M. Church Sanctuary

This non-denominational service celebrates the true story of four World War II U.S. Army Chaplains. Sponsored by American Legion Post 341, this service honors those men who joined together despite their different beliefs. In February of 1943, the U.S.A.T Dorchester sunk in the cold

Atlantic. Lt. George Fox, Lt. Alexander Goode, Lt. John Washington, and Lt. Clark Polling, brought hope in despair and light in darkness. Quickly and quietly, they spread out among the soldiers, trying to calm the frightened, tend the wounded, and guide the disoriented toward safety. When the ship went down, the four chaplains, who had given their life jackets to others, linked arms offered prayers. Of the 902 men aboard the U.S.A.T Dorchester, only 230 survived.

On Sunday, February 11, we will hold a Congregational Conversation about the potential merger with Christ United Methodist Church. This is the first time that members of the congregation (outside of the Council leadership) can enter into formal conversation, ask questions and hear more about the proposal. Please plan to attend so you can be a part of this very important conversation. It has the potential to shift who we are as a church and how we function. The Zoom link will be available in next week's newsletter.



The Talking Points that were developed by a task force of UCC/CUMC members have been published in the January newsletters. Please review those talking points. If you no longer have your newsletters, you can access them through our website at https://greatfallsucc.org/newsletter-archive. Hard copies of the talking points will be available on the Welcome table in the church narthex.

When we gather on February 11, we will also be spending some time exploring the Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats that come to mind in considering a merger with Christ UMC. Please give the following some thought so you can contribute to the conversation.

Listening Points (SWOT)

Strengths: How would our congregations be strengthened through a merger of some kind? What existing strengths might come to light?

i.e. more people in worship on an ongoing basis makes for more effective worship experience

Weakness: How might our congregations be weakened through a merger of some kind? What weaknesses might be revealed in a merger?

i.e. Lack of familiarity with each other's history and polity

Opportunities: What opportunities might you imagine could emerge through the merger of the congregations?

i.e. Christ UMC could engage in a process of discernment to become a Reconciling congregation and the UCC could use this as a refresher course for ONA

Threats: What might feel threatening about a potential merger?

i.e. Challenge to ONA status of UCC

i.e. UCC's History of partnership with DOC that went badly
