The service will be live-streamed and a recording of the livestream service will be available on YouTube later in the day.



Moon Talk

This year, March 25 was the date that determined when Easter would be observed. That's because March 25 was a full moon. Back in 325 CE, the Council of Nicea determined that the celebration of the Resurrection of Christ would be held on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Vernal Equinox. Whew. But not all Christians follow that formula. Our Orthodox friends celebrate the resurrection on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the Passover.

Either way, the celebration of the resurrection of Christ is tied to the moon... the full or whole moon. (I love that one of the key celebrations in the church is

linked to nature!) Christopher Grundy, (Professor of Worship and Preaching at Eden Seminary, Singer/Songwriter, Ordained UCC Minister and all-around wonderful person) wrote a lovely song about the moon as an image of how we are drawn to God. The song is called, "As the Moon." (You can listen to it on YouTube at https://youtu.be/qkDwd0uv178?si=9h7jbGKe9-iqexGN). You may have seen it on our Facebook page earlier in the week. It's a wonderful reminder to take some time to slow down, look up and let nature remind us to reconnect with God through all our cycles of life.

When I saw the full moon on March 25, I was also reminded of a statement I heard or read years ago that the moon is always whole. We may not always be able to see it because the light of the sun doesn't always shine fully on it. Yet, the moon itself is always whole. That image has been a powerful one for me to remember during those seasons of life that come with challenges. Again, leaning into nature, the moon is a reminder that, although we may not always be able to see it fully, God's love is always with us. God's love, like the moon, is always whole. That's one of the things we celebrate on Easter. The fullness of God's love that, even when it seems hardest, is full and whole.

I look forward to celebrating the resurrection with you this Sunday. Don't forget, worship is at 9:30! Bring your family and friends. We're setting up some extra chairs in the sanctuary. Let's fill them!
