
The course will be offered both in person and on Zoom.



As you may have seen on the news, Montana has closed the wait list for the Housing Choice Voucher Program (also known as Section 8). This directly affects many of the families we serve, as well as our shelter families. The Housing Choice Voucher Program is a federally funded program that allows participants to pay 30% of their income for rent, and

the voucher covers the other 70% of the balance. As you can imagine, with the rising cost of housing, this news is a huge blow to the families on the waiting list. Most people (51%) currently utilizing the Housing Choice Voucher Program are elderly or disabled. We're not the only state to shut down the waiting list, Arkansas and Texas have also closed their lists. At this time, it is our intention to continue the course for the families we serve, and to continue to offer our services to those who are eligible (based on funding available). Now, more than ever, donations of all kinds are imperative to our organization. Be it in-kind donations, volunteer hours, or monetary gifts, we appreciate the support of our generous community.

During the event, \$1 from every pint of beer sold will benefit the families we serve.
