Fall Book Study

When the Corps of Discovery headed into the west, they expected they would find a waterway to the Pacific Ocean. What they found instead was mountains. Lots of mountains. If they were going to make their way to the Pacific Ocean, they would have to adapt.

The church (not just our own!) is facing similar challenges. What we have found along the church's journey in mission is not what we expected. It is uncharted territory!

Tod Bolsinger uses the lessons of Lewis and Clark and the Corps of Discovery to help guide churches through times of uncertainty into the future.

Together with Christ United Methodist Church, we will be offering a book study of "Canoeing the Mountains: Christian Leadership in Uncharted Territory" this fall. The course will be offered both in person and on Zoom. There will be six sessions, 2 weeks apart.

In-Person sessions will be Monday's beginning September 9 at 10:30 A.M. Zoom sessions will be Tuesdays beginning September 10 at 6:30 P.M. Each session will be 90 minutes (Zoom information will be published later).

Our Relationship with Christ United Methodist Church

At their June meeting, the Church Council decided to request that Christ UMC present a proposal that would outline what they would be looking for in a merger. We have received a proposal that basically spells out moving forward into a form of a federated church that would lead to the creation of a new organization to be shared by both congregations. The proposal spells out the following:

- Distinct UCC and United Methodist membership and identity would be maintained.
- Rev. Lynne would serve as pastor of the new organization as Rev. Dawn's time and call is shifted more towards First UMC.
- All future Pastoral leadership of one pastor would be determined by the UCC model of search and call.
- Ministries, programs, property and operating budget would be unified.
- Denominational (UCC and UMC) polity would be used to help each congregation transfer assets and combine resources.
- Relationships with each of the denominations would be maintained through membership, denominational financial support, and ongoing relationship with wider church leadership.

Christ UMC has asked that First Congregational UCC respond to them within 30 days of the proposal (7/25/24). The full proposal has been shared with the church council who will have a special meeting on August 11 at 6:30 P.M. to discuss the proposal, form a special committee to create a response. The response will be finalized at the regular Council meeting on August 19.

Rev. Lynne, Dick Kloppel and Karen Spencer met with Rev. Dr. Tony Clark, Transitional Conference Minister on July 30. Dick, Karen, Lynne and Tony met with CUMC leadership and UM District Superintendent, Karen McRae, met this past Tuesday, August 6. At that meeting, UCC leadership reminded our UM friends that, due to our congregational polity, change in the UCC happens slowly and calls for congregational involvement. All leadership is realizing that we will be entering into a time of holy experimentation as we try out several aspects of ministry before making permanent changes.

The Council and Christ UMC leadership realize that there are a lot of details to be worked out and it will take some time to proceed faithfully and honorably.

Because of our polity, no decisions will be made without congregational involvement. Keep an eye on future newsletters for more information and how you can be involved.
