## Important Congregational Conversation This Sunday September 22, approximately 10:00 A.M.

Following an abbreviated service, everyone is invited to remain in the sanctuary for some updates and general Q&A. There will be time after that for each congregation to hold their own conversations; Christ UMC in the Fellowship Hall and UCC in the Sanctuary. Fellowship refreshments will be available. Some significant updates in the ongoing conversation:

- Beginning in October, Holly will publish a unified newsletter containing information from both congregations
- A unified budget will be prepared for 2025
- Rev. Lynne is taking the lead on all worship services
- Now through the end of October, Rev. Dawn will participate in 2 services per month (honoring her ½ time appointment with Christ UMC) and will preach once in October
- Christ UMC is contributing financial support for unified worship and newsletter expenses
- Unified ministries will continue to take shape with Christ UMC representation on boards
- Members of both congregations are invited to participate in all activities, regardless of who
  is offering them

Christ UMC's leadership has offered a response to our Council's latest requests which included some clarification around Rev. Dawn's timeline and changing responsibilities; sharing of financial information; and obtaining an appraisal of our portion of the property and building. **Details of this response will be discussed at the Congregational Conversation this Sunday**.

#### Christian Education News

Children age 5-8<sup>th</sup> grade will spend the morning in Sunday School. Sunday School and worship will be abbreviated (about 30 minutes) to make extra time for continued discussion regarding merger plans. For program year 2024-45, the Christian Education Board has adopted the theme "Caring For . . .". The meeting is co-hosted by First and Mayflower churches with some additional support for some meals and hosting by other churches in the area. It's going to be a big deal.

You will be represented by lay delegates **Dean Jardee**, **June Rovero** (who will be participating virtually), **Carol Shipley**, and **Ray Young**. In addition, **Hank Branom** and **Denise Jackson** will be there as members of the Board of Directors. This meeting will mark the conclusion of Hank's term as Conference Moderator. Denise continues her term as chair of the Committee for Outdoor Ministries. **Rev. Sara Branom and I will be attending as clergy delegates**. I'm actually checking



off two boxes because I'm a member of the Board, serving as secretary. During the meeting, **Liz Lee** will be part of the slate of nominees to be elected to serve in Conference leadership. She has been nominated for Human Resource ministry. Carol Shipley has been nominated to serve as General Synod Delegate. Dean Jardee will be part of the Conference Minister Search Committee who has recommended that Tony Clark be called as our Conference Minister. There will be A LOT of folks from Great Falls present and active in Billings.

As you can see by the logo, the theme of this meeting is about creating a culture of call. Looking at the list of folks who have responded to an invitation to serve the church from Great Falls, I wonder about what is it about who we are as a community of faith that fosters such leadership. I'm no expert in the development of church leadership but this is what I've seen over the years.

People are willing to serve:

- When they believe in the mission
- When the efforts of the organization has benefited them personally
- When they know the organization is making a difference in people's lives
- When they know that what they can offer (time, insights, talents) will be honored and utilized well
- When they know the organization is utilizing resources well and with integrity

I've also discovered that people have a sense of call to what the organization is doing. They usually have a passion for something and recognize that there's a need that that passion can fill. Author Frederick Buechner put it this way:

"The place God calls you to is the place where your deep gladness and the world's deep hunger meet."

That's when I think about our own church and the people that are involved in the various ministries we offer. The folks who love food and feeding people and creating an atmosphere of hospitality fulfill their calling on the Fellowship Board. Folks who love kids and faith fulfill their calling on

the Christian Education Board and teaching Sunday school. People who get a kick out of working with numbers and organizing physical resources make great treasurers and Business Affairs Board members. People who have a passion for worship and the care of souls may just have a call to ministry. You get the idea.

We are in the midst of our stewardship campaign. We are in the midst of the conversation with Christ United Methodist about the possibility of merging our ministries. We are in the midst of exciting times. What is it that you gives you deep gladness and how can you bring that together with the needs of the world (or the church)? Stewardship is about more than money and budgets. It's a ministry and mission. Certainly, money and budgets are part of what makes the ministry and mission happen. So, too, do your passions and the sharing of your gifts, talents and time. If you've set the Opportunities to Serve form aside, thinking that there's nothing there for you, think again. Spend some time thinking about what gives you great joy then pick up that form and look at the needs. There is somewhere that those two things will come together.

Let us continue to imagine together that we are creating a culture of love and service and within that, a culture of call where people's gifts are called forth, honored and used to create a world of extravagant love and grace.
