In the United Church of Christ, the authority to ordain ministers and to grant ministerial standing is given to Associations. In our case, the Montana - N. Wyoming Conference acts as an Association. Our Church and Ministry Commission has been meeting with Barbara Gulick as a Member-in-Discernment to guide her preparation and call to authorized ministry. Barbara has prepared an ordination portfolio for review by the Church and Ministry Commission, and is recommended as a candidate for an Ecclesiastical Council. Delegates from local churches are invited to the Ecclesiastical Council to examine Barbara's ordination paper and to ask questions about her faith, practices, and readiness to serve as an authorized minister, and then vote to approve or disapprove her for ordination.

With Each Word a Child Reads, They Are Gaining Knowledge Imagine Volunteering Together and Building Readers



Volunteers are needed to join the reading program at West Elementary. The goal is to build strong readers in elementary school so that all children leave elementary school with solid reading skills and habits. In the 2023-2024 school year, the GFPS piloted a group tutoring model in two elementary schools. The evaluations from students, teachers, principals, and volunteers are showing positive results, and both schools—and their volunteers—want to continue Building Readers next year. For 2024-2025, they aim to add five

more elementary schools to the project, including West Elementary School. Here's how it works: A group of at least 5-7 adults each agree to spend 1 hour per week in an elementary school. The adults each cover a day of the week and cover or trade with each other when their schedule changes or one person goes on vacation. This means the young readers get extra practice every day of the week—and get to know at least 5 wonderful volunteers in our community! Volunteers have one student at a time join them to practice reading skills for 5-10 minutes. Volunteers see about 5-7 children in that hour. Before meeting the young readers, volunteers complete a 90-minute training, complete a background check at GFPS, get a tour of the school, and meet the school Principal.

- > Training starts the week of September 16, 2024
- ➤ The Building Readers program is scheduled to begin October 1, 2024
- ➤ Background checks through the school district are necessary to participate. They are provided at the GFPS district office at 1100 4th St. S. Go to the HR office at the east end of the main building (door M). If you've had a background check through the school district, you should be okay, unless it's been quite a while since you have volunteered.
- What you can do in the meantime: Check your schedule to see if you are available for training the week of September 16. Get your background check done before then.
