The beginning of year school supplies are always needed, as many of our families show up to open house or the first day of school without supplies. We were able to put your donated materials on tables during the first week of school for many families in need. Many people expressed appreciation for the school supplies to our office staff, as they were unable to afford them on their own. Some teachers also made use of the supplies for students who had not brought any, relieving them of spending their own money.

The food pantry items were also a blessing. Last year, we dispersed over 250 complete food boxes from our West pantry to families in need. This does not include the many holiday meal boxes your church and other organizations provide for our families. Many of our students depend on our pantry services, and because of this our shelves were bare after last spring. - Clean inside covers of main entrance exterior lights
