Shoebox Christmas

You are invited to participate in the annual shoebox Christmas event, a mission of the Blackfeet United Methodist Parish in Browning, MT. The Blackfeet United Methodist Parish serves the people who live on the Blackfeet Indian Reservation. The majority of the present-day residents living on the Blackfeet Reservation are bloodline descendants of the original indigenous inhabitants of this area. At Christmastime, there is a collection of shoeboxes filled with age-appropriate items for male and female, aged birth to adult. The boxes will be collected now through December 10 before being delivered to Browning beginning December 15. Use the labels listed below indicating if your box is for male or female and the age group. These labels will also be on the table in the narthex and have ideas listed for gifts.

MALE OR FEMALE 0-12 MONTHS

Basic transport needs, basic diapers, powder, cream, bath wash, towels, layette sets, clothes, soft toys, teething toys, blankets, bed sets, changing cloths/wipes

MALE OR FEMALE 12-24 MONTHS

Pull-Ups, bath wash, towels, pajamas, clothes, learning toys, physically stimulating toys

MALE OR FEMALE 1-3 YRS. OLD

Bath wash, towels, tooth care, pajamas, clothes, gloves, mittens, hat, scarf, sweaters, sweatshirts, thermal underwear, snow suit, learning toys, physically stimulating toys, books that can be read to them (nursery rhymes)

MALE OR FEMALE 4-6 YRS. OLD

Bath wash, towels, tooth care, pajamas, clothes, gloves, mittens, hat, scarf, sweaters, sweatshirts, thermal underwear, snow suit, learning toys, physically stimulating toys, books to be read to them (Golden Oldies, Three Bears, Three Pigs)

MALE OR FEMALE 7-12 YRS. OLD

Bath essentials, self-care essentials, gloves, mittens, hat, scarf, sweaters, sweatshirts, thermal underwear, snow suit, learning toys (Legos, board games), physically stimulating toys (balls, marbles, jacks), books to read (adventure, nature)

MALE OR FEMALE 13-18 YRS. OLD

Bath essentials, self-care essentials, gloves, mittens, hat, scarf, sweaters, sweatshirts, thermal underwear, snow suit, board games, physically stimulating toys (balls), books to read (adventure, nature, mystery)

MALE OR FEMALE ADULT

Self-care essentials, gloves, mittens, hat, scarf, sweaters, sweatshirts, thermal underwear, snow pants, books to read (adventure, nature, mystery, self-help)
