#### Mosaic Community Church

I'd like to share my reasoning for choosing **Mosaic Community Church**. As a member of the Search and Call Committee, I was struck by a concern from two promising candidates. They felt that names combining our old ones didn't signal a new future. They saw it as re-naming, not a true transformation. This got me thinking: what do we really want to accomplish? Do we want to simply maintain our current family, or do we want to grow and reach new people? The name we choose should reflect our answer.

A name like **Mosaic Community Church** offers a fresh start. A mosaic is beautiful art made of many different, broken pieces. I'm reminded of our church retreat a few years ago centered on this very idea. We are two churches coming together, each with our own history and people. By joining our broken and beautiful pieces, we create something new and whole—a powerful symbol of unity and a visible demonstration that everyone belongs here, no matter their background.

This name shows the community that we aren't just a traditional church combining two denominations. We are a new entity, welcoming and accepting of all. It tells the story of our journey while also pointing toward a future of growth and inclusion. It represents the best of who we are and who we can become.

A **Mosaic Church** is more than a name; it's a living metaphor for what we are called to be. It's a Christian community that draws inspiration from a mosaic—a whole image created from diverse pieces. This name tells everyone who walks through our doors that they have a place here. It says to the person who feels broken, that they are valued and essential. It says to the community around us that we are a place of unity and love, welcoming all. 

#### A Note From Your Moderator:


As we approach Sunday's Congregational meeting, I want to thank you for your conversations, questions, and careful consideration in the discernment process of naming our church. This past week, the church leadership became aware that some churches using the name "Mosaic" have faced criticism for their policies regarding the LGBTQ+ community and women in leadership. We are sharing this information with you so that you have time for reflection and further research if you choose. Note that there are Mosaic churches, such as Mosaic Community Church (UCC) in Oklahoma City, which are ONA (Open and Affirming) or Reconciling, and they share beliefs and practices that mirror those of our own congregation. A similar contradiction likely exists comparing churches using Christ United but may be less apparent since the name is less distinctive.

Ultimately the name our members select will reflect who we are as Christians, what we believe, and the mission of our local church. Let us move forward in prayer remembering that God is still speaking. May we have ears to listen. Kind regards, Karen Spencer, Moderator

#### Neighbors In Need

Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ.
-Galatians 6:2

The Neighbors in Need offering supports ministries of justice and compassion, with one-third of the offering given to the Council for American Indian Ministries and the remaining two-thirds supporting UCC justice ministries.

The Council for American Indian Ministry (CAIM) is the voice for American Indian people in the UCC. CAIM provides Christian ministry and witness to American Indians and to the wider church. Justice issues that affect American Indian life are communicated to the whole UCC by CAIM. Historically, the forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin and northern Nebraska.

Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. CAIM supports these local churches and their pastors. In addition, CAIM strives to be a resource for more than 1,000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations and to strengthen their participation in the life of the church.

The Love of Church Ministries (LOC) of the United Church of Christ supports congregations and other settings of the church in doing justice, seeking peace, and building vibrant faith communities that are welcoming to all. From the National Setting in Cleveland, Ohio, Love of Church is responsible for supporting local churches with worship and faith-forming publications, resources, research and development, and education. The ministries and services of the Love of Church Ministries are central to the identity of the United Church of Christ.
