

#### In Other FISH News

The last week of October was the best week this year for FISH with 45 clients, 69 adults and 61 children. We gave out over 3,000 lbs. of food! The first week of November we are seeing an increase in numbers compared to what we normally see at the beginning of a month. If we continue to see these increases, we could spend over \$50,000 this year just for food. You may have seen the Town Pump TV ads asking for cash donations to be made at their facilities to support Food Banks. We have been blessed over the years to be part their giving program where they match donations. This year the challenge is \$25,000. The FISH 10 churches have been able to match the challenge over the years. We need your donation to be able to meet the \$25,000 challenge that will give us a total of \$50,000. #### United Women in Faith

Friendly reminder that our monthly meeting is on Thursday, November 20 at 1:00 P.M. in Fellowship Hall. This month's meeting will focus on helping to feed our community. Easy meal bags filled with non-perishable foods will support families in need right here in Great Falls. These bags will provide quick and easy nourishing options for those who may not always have access to them. Molly Beck has volunteered to do all of the shopping. Monetary donations will be accepted now through November 20 to reimburse Molly for the food that will be bagged up at the meeting. Food donations can also be brought to the meeting to be included in the meal bags. Canned items such as turkey, chicken, cream of chicken soup, evaporated milk, diced tomatoes, mixed vegetables, green beans, black beans, kidney beans, pinto beans, tomato sauce, and tomatoes and green chiles are key ingredients to the healthy meals planned for this outreach. Dry ingredients are: box of garlic & herb biscuit mix (with seasoning packet), bouillon cubes, box of stuffing mix, instant mashed potatoes, gravy packet for two cups, and packet of chili seasoning. No loopholes. No theological disclaimers. No culture-war camouflage.

Just love. Real, Inconvenient. Unconditional love.

"Love the sinner, hate the sin" isn't in the Bible. Some pretend it is.

It sounds spiritual. It feels righteous. But it's not something Jesus ever said. In fact, it's one of those phrases Christians quote when we want to sound holy with actually not being holy. Because let's be honest - the "hate the sin" part always seems to get in the way of the "love the sinner" part. We love that phrase because it gives us permission. Permission to judge. Permission to label. Permission to love with an asterisk. It's a way of saying. "Of course I love you, but ..." and everything after that "but" usually sounds nothing like Jesus. Jesus didn't say, "Love the sinner, hate the sin."

He said, "Do not judge."

He said, "Love your neighbor."

He said, "By this everyone will know that you are My disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:35)

When we "love the sinner, hate the sin," we're not just calling out sin - we're often calling into question someone's worth. As if loving others comes with fine print. As if God's love needs our approval first. News flash: It doesn't. The only sin Jesus ever seemed to "hate" was hypocrisy - the religious kind that builds walls between God and people. And the only sinners He ever scolded were the ones who thought they weren't sinners at all.

Imagine a world where followers of Jesus simply... loved. No loopholes. No theological disclaimers. No culture-war camouflage. Just love. Real. Inconvenient. Unconditional love. Because when we stand before God someday, God's not going to ask how effectively we "hated sin." God's going to ask how faithfully we loved people. And "I was busy judging them for You" won't hold up as an answer. Just love, God will sort the rest of it out.

### Pastoral Prayer

That one that I loved, O God, is now with you. I can say that, not knowing "how" or "where," but say it because it makes no sense that so rich and full a life would come to an abrupt end... except for memories. Still, I am bereft for she is not with me.

I listen to all the clichés of my friends, spoken to console me: "She is better off." "She is past her pain and suffering." "She is in heaven," whatever that means. I listen and am not consoled. My grief is selfish. I want to feel her touch and hear her voice and see her smile. I am confident she is with you, and I am just as confident, O Lord, You understand how it is for me.

I cannot help recalling times I might have been gentler, softer, more thoughtful. I wish I could live some hours over. I wish I could say "I love you" just one more time. These failures I must accept.

"Time heals all things," they say. I do not believe time does anything. You, O God, are Healer and Helper. You can heal me in time, help me through the lonely days and long nights. You can give me renewed zest for going on and entering into life once more.

"Thanks be to God who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ." I believe that. But right now, I grieve; I am hurt; I am bereft. Thanks be to God who understands through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
