News from Search and Call

If you were not in church on Sunday, you missed a **big announcement** from the Search and Call Committee. We have found the person we would like as our next called minister, and **Laura Kae Ymker** (pronounced Emker) would love to be our spiritual leader! She will be in Great Falls for her candidating weekend February 7 and 8. She completed her Member in Discernment at the UCC Church in Red Lodge with her Ecclesiastical Council held on January 17. Her ordination will occur in the near future. **The committee is excited for everyone to meet Laura and there will be an opportunity to do that on February 7. At 9:30 A.M., the Council will have brunch with her and from 1:00 to 4:00 P.M., members and friends of the church are invited to a dessert open house.** Both events will be in the Fellowship Hall.

Laura received her BA in history in 2007 and her Masters of Divinity in 2021. She comes to us with a diverse theological background. One of the most meaningful to her is time spent as a recovery ministry leader in Hoboken, NJ where participants included people in recovery from heroin, nicotine, alcohol, and sexual addictions; depression; codependency; and abuse, leading a small church, organizing worship for weekly large group meetings that had the format of a church service. She brings many lessons learned here into her future ministry.

In her profile, Laura stated, "My curiosity, adventurous spirit, and desire for spiritual authenticity have led to me experiencing multiple traditions (Hyper-Calvinist, Baptist, Nondenominational, Lutheran, Charismatic, Episcopal, Quaker, UCC), living in multiple states (SD, DC, VA, NY, CA, NJ, WY, MT), and working in a variety of fields. These experiences led to my appreciation for diverse theology, provided experience in administrative tasks necessary to run a church, and enabled me to better understand people. In recent years, I've started looking forward to settling down and staying in one place."

Be sure to **attend church on February 8** because Laura will lead worship. A meeting of the congregation will then be held where questions can be asked of the Search and Call Committee, and a vote will take place on whether the church approves Laura Ymker to be our called minister.

14th Annual Four Chaplains Memorial Service ***Sunday, February 1, 2026 at 2:00 P.M.*** ***Church Sanctuary (doors open at 1:15 P.M.)***

This non-denominational service celebrates the true story of four World War II U.S. Army Chaplains. **Sponsored by American Legion Post 341, this service honors those men who joined together despite their different beliefs.** In February of 1943, the U.S.A.T. Dorchester sunk in the cold Atlantic. Lt. George Fox, Lt.

Alexander Goode, Lt. John Washington, and Lt. Clark Polling, brought hope in despair and light in darkness. Quickly and quietly, they spread out among the soldiers, trying to calm the frightened, tend the wounded, and guide the disoriented toward safety. When the ship went down, the four chaplains, who had given their life jackets to others, linked arms offered prayers. Of the 902 men aboard the U.S.A.T. Dorchester, only 230 survived. **Guest Chaplains will include Montana Air National Guard, the Jewish Community, and 341st Wing at Malmstrom Airforce Base.**

Kintsugi is the Japanese art of repairing broken pottery by mending the cracks with lacquer mixed with powdered gold, silver, or platinum, celebrating the breakage as part of the object's unique history rather than hiding it. This practice embodies the philosophy of wabi-sabi, finding beauty in

imperfection, and symbolizes resilience, showing how mended items become stronger and more beautiful, often seen as a metaphor for life's healing process. We are all like kintsugi art. Healing, recovering, is a testament not to perfection, nor erasure, but to grace. We are restored by love, made whole by presence and shining with the gold of God's mercy. Holy One, may we understand our brokenness is not the end of the story but the beginning of a new one.

The Exploration Committee has concluded its work on the Bylaws for our federating churches. They are a blend of the practices of our congregations and are informed by the Constitution and Bylaws of the United Church of Christ and The Book of Discipline of The United Methodist Church. The drafting of these Bylaws was a collaborative effort by members of both congregations, the Exploration Committee, the Church Council, and leaders from our denominational conferences.

The Exploration Committee recognizes that we are merging two congregations, but they remain affiliated with our two denominations. It is this premise that guides the internal management and operating procedures for our officers and boards, ensuring that important differences are recognized while articulating how we operate as a single congregation. Just as our operations have changed in the past, they will continue to evolve, and the bylaws will reflect those changes.

Based on the congregation's charge to the Exploration Committee, we ask that these bylaws be adopted as written. The Exploration Committee is prepared to answer questions at a Special Meeting of the congregations in March. Further, the Committee recommends that the federated church operate under these bylaws for a calendar year, and during that time, the Exploration Committee will seek feedback from the boards, officers, and congregation on their effectiveness.
